Cult of Creed: An Onomastic Analysis of Lawyers Dr. Muhammad Riaz

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ABSTRACT

This study looks into how lawyers in Pakistan choose their names. It aims to understand the cultural and mental reasons behind these decisions, focusing on a "Cult of Creed" within the legal profession mainly. To do this research, a collection of Gujranwala lawyer's names was made by the researcher and then listed those which had last-names too. A careful selection process was used to pick the 50 most often-used names. We studied the names and used a social and psychological theory to help guide our work on legal name analysis. Studies showed that when lawyers from Pakistan chose names, they were greatly influenced by their culture and beliefs. This shows how hard identity can be in the legal world. This research shows how social-mental language practices, like naming customs, really work. It stresses the key part culture and religion play inside law people groups. The study suggests that teaching about different cultures, religions and training in law education can help make laws friendlier and more equal in Pakistan.

Introduction

Normally, the word onomastics or onomatology means studying names and where they come from. It covers all sorts of proper names used anywhere you can think about it. These common names might be language, location or place titles. They could also refer to person and animal names. Koopman (2002), a top scholar in Southern African onomastic says that the word 'onomastics' comes from Greek. It means "name". He further cogently mentions that onomastics is:

The study of names and naming systems. In any language, names are nouns, in the word category of proper nouns or proper names. As names are linguistic units which normally operate within a social context, onomastics can be considered as a branch of sociolinguistics. (p. 8)

Machaba (2004) defines the term 'onomastics' in a comprehensive way. She defines onomastics as:

A branch of sociolinguistics that comprises naming, renaming and denaming of entities. Onomastics as a study, goes beyond looking at the linguistic features of names, but also looks at the sociocultural and psychological factors that influence the choice of a name given to an entity by the namer. (p. 25)

The law field in Pakistan has a long and varied history tightly connected with the social-politics of the country. Lawyers are key to create the legal world and fight for justice. So, it is important to study their culture and work together. This study begins a searching journey into the world of lawyers in Pakistan. The main focus will be on their names and what they symbolize. In doing this, we look at the idea of "Cult of Creed" This word is used to show how lawyers and their names are linked with different ideas they believe in. This research uses a method that focuses on the names and job titles of

lawyers in Pakistan. It aids us in knowing the secret social and cultural aspects that impact their job identity.

The lawyers in Pakistan come from many different groups and have a complex past. This shows how mixed the society of their country is. Lawyers in Pakistan usually come from various ethnic, religious and language backgrounds. Each group has its own special naming traditions. As Zahoor and Gujjar (2019) say, "Names in Pakistan are not merely labels; they are potent symbols of cultural identity, religion, and social status." This tells us how important names are in the Pakistani places. So studying them is helpful to know more about lawyers and their devotion according to creed.

Names, as labels, can change the way we see and expect things. In the legal world, picking a name or title can be important. It shows what kind of professional image a lawyer wants to give out. As Peyton and others wrote in 2019, "Lawyers' names often show what they hope for or how they want to be seen." So this study will try looking at deep meanings hidden inside the name of lawyers from Pakistan. It aims to discover why Pakistani legal professionals really choose their names as it shapes who people think they are when doing law work. The "Cult of Creed" in the legal field is not just happening alone, but it's a big part of wider culture and society trends in Pakistan. The legal job is very much affected by old, religious and social things which show up in the names and titles used by lawyers. Ashraf assert that "Lawyers in Pakistan often draw upon religious and historical figures in choosing their names, seeking to align themselves with revered personalities and values."

Legal groups, legal boards and professional organizations in Pakistan often use names or titles that have special meaning. The "Cult of Creed" can cover the whole legal group too. Skead et al. (2018) remark that "These names serve as a reflection of the collective identity and aspirations of the legal community, emphasizing shared values and objectives." Examining how lawyers in Pakistan pick out special words can help us understand better everything that shared mindset is like among these people.

To really understand the "Cult of Creed" among lawyers in Pakistan, we need to think about how words affect us and because there are so many different languages. Pakistan is a place where many languages are used and lawyers often speak in different languages when doing their work. Jacobs and Maryns (2021) claims, "Language plays a crucial role in the naming practices of lawyers, as it can convey a sense of authority and expertise." Looking at words used in lawyer's name also makes studying their rules deeper because it shows the way language ties with culture and what being an attorney means. Rehman et al (2021) said that International connections and modern changes have brought new ways to the legal business in Pakistan. They influence what things people call in courts and also lawyer names. The "Creed Cult" among Pakistani lawyers is a hard subject. It's closely tied to their country's culture, history and language in Pakistan. This study of names looks at why these names matter for people and groups to figure out what it means to be a lawyer there. By looking at how names, culture and society mix or come together in Pakistan, this study helps us see better what role lawyers take on. It also shows how it affects what their country does in politics too.

Literature Review

The names of lawyers in Pakistan also change based on gender. A study by Douglas in 2018 found that women lawyers often have special problems with their names and titles. Material and Methods

names from Gujranwala's legal council. This group of words was then studied carefully using AntConc 3.5.9 software tool. The study picked just the 50 most often used last names in this group of words. Using the Social Psycholinguistic Theory for Legal Names, this study used a planned method. It started by looking at the history of these last names, then deeply studying their features that describe something. The last part of the study looked into "Cult of Creed," found in these surnames. The study used Social-Psycholinguistic Theory to understand the meaning and history behind these legal last names. Its main goals were reached as it added light on their past, description features, plus cultural parts too.

Results and Discussion

The researcher made a group of names for lawyers in Gujranwala. Researcher used AntConc 3.5.9 software to work with that data. This step made a list of words, and from it 200 or more last names were picked out. However, for the purpose of this study, only the 50 surnames that were most frequently used were selected for further analysis. These selected surnames or cast names are presented in Table 1 below:
